EMMAUS HIGH SCHOOL



Built in 1955, Emmaus High School is a four-year comprehensive high school. The Commission of Secondary Schools, and the Department of Education of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania accredit Emmaus High School.

Emmaus High School provides a variety of academic opportunities for students. Students have the opportunity to enroll in trade or technical courses through Lehigh Career and Technical Institute (LCTI). The Virtual East Penn Academy (VESPA) is a full time online learning program that provides students an option to complete coursework using various content vendors. HIVE is a credit recovery program designed to assist students in meeting graduation requirements in grades 11 and 12. Dual enrollment opportunities to earn college credits are available through a partnership with Lehigh Carbon Community College (LCCC) and the West Chester University Credit by Exam program. Project Lead The Way (PLTW) provides students with a rigorous and innovative Science, Technology, Engineering, and Mathematics (STEM) education curricular program at the high school level. For the 2020-2021 academic year, final grades were awarded based on marking period and/or semester coursework and did not include mid-term and final exams.




In 2023-2024, students took a total of 1,275 Advanced Placement tests. Seventy eight percent of the scores were three or higher.


